Our speaker, Jeri Fleming, from the GRDA, spoke on the watershed that affects Grand Lake and bot point-source (know the source) and non-point source (don't know the source) pollution. 10,642 miles in Oklahoma are impaired by something or about 1/3 of the water. The GRDA has a septic tank replacement program in place for failing tanks. Current funding for this program ends in June with three tanks replaced in Ketchum and Monkey Island. Grand Lake was originally built to bring water to the Cherokee nation but has more uses now.
